Mission EmployAble runs Supported Internships on the Bucks/Herts border, from September – July

- ✓ Are you a young person with a learning disability (aged 18-25) wanting to develop new skills?
- ✓ Do you have an active EHCP?
- ✓ Have you passed Entry Level 1 for both Functional English and Maths?
- ✓ Can you travel independently or SEND taxi? If not we will do Travel Training.
- ✓ Do you want to train to enable you to get paid work?
- ✓ Does your family or carer want the same for you?

If YES to the above, a Supported Internship with Mission EmployAble could be the perfect opportunity for you!

Our Supported Internship is the perfect opportunity for young people with learning disabilities to find paid work! Running from September to July, you'll dive into classroom learning, hands-on work experience, and an awesome enrichment programme where you can make friends and have fun!

In class, you'll work on functional maths & English, plus independence, and employability skills. You'll be trained to

work in the cafe, warehouse and horticulture facility in small groups. You will have individual supported work experience in a job you might like to do long-term! Plus, you can join other projects like design and marketing, tennis coaching, and mental health support.

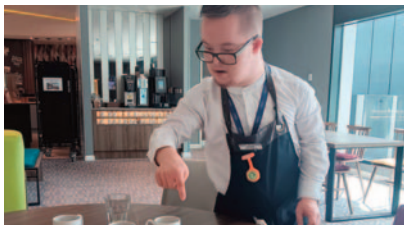
And don't forget the weekend fun including an opportunity to join Herts Super 1st Disability Cricket training. Let's make your future bright together!

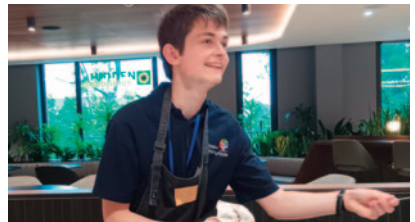


Will I get support?
